Student Led Conferences were held yesterday and I thank the many parents who attended the school to spend precious and valuable time with their children participating in a conversation along with the home group teacher. The conferences provided students the opportunity to share and demonstrate their learning goals, learning growth and achievements. In this setting the student takes responsibility for setting their own learning goals and shares their learning based on self, peer and teacher based feedback. The conferences are also a powerful tool to build the home and school partnership and the opportunity to celebrate the student's success. Research shows through Student Led Conferences the enhanced development of real life skills in the areas of communication, organization, confidence and self reflection. A short survey is to be provided to gain feedback on the parent opinion of the effectiveness of Student Led Conferences. Teachers are available by appointment to provide feedback on your child's progress with their learning at any stage during the school year.

Cyber Smart- Stay safe

- Be careful who you trust on line. Making new friends can be fun, but there is a chance that they may not be who they say they are.
- Set your profile to "private" so your personal information is kept secret.
- Tell your parents if language, pictures or anything scary on the Internet upsets you.
- Always keep your password a secret.
- Think before you post information online- once posted it is always there.
- Don't open messages from people you don't know. These could contain viruses.
- Ask your parents before you give anyone on the Internet your name address or any personal details.
- If someone is nasty, offensive or makes you feel uncomfortable in a chat room, don't respond and leave straight away. You can report the situation to the website or Internet service provider and ask them to remove the content.

Tips for Parents

It is vital that you have regular open communication with your children about what they do online. Establish rules about online use (e.g. always use the Internet in a family space) and monitor compliance with those rules. Agree that your child will always treat others with respect online, and let you know if anything happens that upsets them. Familiarise yourself with how to report inappropriate content on social media sites.

Note: The minimum age that children are allowed by law to access social media sites including Facebook and You Tube is 13 years old.

Important Information for Parents

The final date for submitting 2016 student booklists and payments to the school is **Friday 27/11/15**.

Payments and orders can only be made at the school. Online orders are **not** available for 2016 student supplies.

Student book packs are specifically designed by teachers to support the teaching and learning of each year level of students in our school. Some items in these packs are not available for purchase from public stationary suppliers.

Parents have the choice of either collecting their child's pre-paid and pre-ordered book pack from the school's gym on Thursday 21st January 2016 between 10.00am and 2.00pm or have the book pack delivered straight to the student's classroom where it will be ready and waiting on the first day of school. Please indicate on the booklist by ticking the box of your preferred option.

The cost of \$180.00 includes individual student stationary packs (book packs) as well as items supplied directly to your child by the school i.e. Mathletics subscription (Mathletics can be accessed at school and home), photocopying related costs, art and craft supplies, ICT items and Café Reading program supplies.

Payments can be made by cheque payable to Cranbourne East Primary School, Credit Card (over the phone payments accepted), or by cash. Booklists and payments can also be sent to school with your child to the teacher in a named, sealed envelope. A receipt will be processed and sent home.

If you are going away on holidays prior to the booklist due date, or wish to discuss any aspect of the ordering, payment or booklist process please contact the school before 27/11/15 on 59900400.
