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FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Hi Everyone

Student Free days, commonly known as Curriculum Days, are vital and valuable days where staff complete a range of professional learning activities or as in this year offer a reporting day to parents. Last night the School Council approved the 2016 professional learning days. The DET mandated student free day is always the first day of the school year and in 2016 the first student free day will be Wednesday 27th January. The second student free day is scheduled for Thursday 28th January. Students will commence school on Friday 29th January 2016 at 9:00am sharp.

It is on these two days the staff complete final preparation for the commencement of the school year ready for the arrival of students. It is here we as a whole staff, revisit some of the key aspects of our successful teaching and learning programs including delivery of teaching and learning through the Co-Teaching model. While you see learning improvement in your child, it does not just happen, it happens with teachers continuing to participate in best practice learning, planning the curriculum together, developing and evaluating student assessment data and using the data to provide rich learning tasks aimed at the student point of entry and point of need in their learning. The next student free day will be Monday 15th February. The final student free day in 2016 is pending approval once additional information is confirmed.

School Council Report: At the meeting held last night, the DET contracted reviewer presented a summary of the recent School Peer Review. The report focused on student achievement, student engagement, wellbeing and productivity. The school received a highly positive report in all respects based on the achievement of goals and targets identified in the four year Strategic Plan (2012-2015). The Victorian Registrations and Qualifications Authority (school operational compliance, operating policies and procedures) assessment of the school was regarded as outstanding and the best ever presented for a school review. A report is to be published on the school website in early term 1 2016. The confirmed 2016 school budget was presented and approved followed by the Principal's Report and Parent's Association Report. General business included approving School Council Approved Parent Helpers. I wish all families a happy Christmas and best wishes for the New Year –

From the Welfare Officer

Video games the reality

Please read the following information that the school has received from a social worker who works with children at schools in our network. Rita has felt it necessary to inform us that she is seeing a lot of children who are spending far too much time playing Xbox and PlayStation games with high level ratings namely, Assassins Creed, Grand Theft Auto and call of Duty.

Studies show that video games with violent content are linked to more aggressive behaviour in teens and children. This is a concern because most of the games mentioned above are highly popular and I am beginning to see a strong correlation between my referrals for "Anger Management" and the use of these video games.

Part of the increase in aggressive behaviour is linked to the amount of time children are allowed to play video games. I understand some of our parents *may not know or may not be aware of these high level ratings* however this is where as a school we can start to inform them about the dangers of long term subjective exposure to these types of games.

Playing video games for long periods of times on a daily basis, (like I am seeing with some of my referrals) does increase aggressive behaviours, because violent acts are continually repeated throughout the video game. This method of repetition has long been considered an effective teaching method in reinforcing learning patterns. Their brains are like sponges hence why we are seeing an increase in reactive violent behaviours.

Bare in mind, Assassins Creed and Grand Theft Auto are 18+ Games. Call of Duty is 16+, I understand we have no final say, however we can **support** parents in making informed decisions around the use of these games and the affects it can be having on their child's behaviour and ability to regulate their own emotions.

I have successfully seen positive results with Anger Management/Emotional Regulation with some of my parents who have taken on board my advice. However - there are also some parents who will continue to lose the battle with their child regarding Video Games.

Because of the popularity of video games, completely eliminating them from the child's life might be difficult. However, parents can decrease the negative impact that they have on their child. Here are a few tips, for parents:

- Know the rating of the video games your child is playing.
- Do not install video game equipment in your child's bedroom.
- Set limits on how often and how long your child is allowed to play video games.
- Supervise your child's Internet use—there are now many "video games" available for playing online.
- Take the time to discuss with your children the games they are playing or other media they are watching. Ask your children how they feel about what they observe in these video games, television programs or movies. This is an opportunity to share your feelings and grow closer with your child.
- Share with other parents' information about certain games or ideas for helping each other in parenting.

So just some food for thought, it may be a question worth exploring when working with children that are displaying difficult behaviours.
