## From the Welfare Officer

### How to build Resilience in young people

Resilience is the happy knack of being able to bungy jump through life. When the pitfalls and difficult times do happen your child will have the skills to cope with them. Here are some ideas to promote resilience:

1. Try to promote a sense of family life so your children feel they belong to the family and they feel their opinions are listened to.
2. Have positive and reasonably high expectations for your children.
3. Provide them with opportunities for meaningful participation in age appropriate responsibilities.
4. Protect children from feeling they have to grow up too quickly, by maintaining family rules. Children do not anticipate risks in that same way as adults do.
5. Try to keep their friendship groups as wide and diverse as possible.
6. Encourage them to belong to at least one club, sport or other interest group.
7. If possible link them up with a caring trustworthy adult from outside the family.
8. Maintain family celebrations.
9. Try to encourage a sense of curiosity and spontaneity about life.
10. Most importantly nourish your own resilience and wellbeing so that you can show them how to live life.
