FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Hi Everyone

A special mention of thanks is sent out to all parents who attended the Parent Teacher Interviews conducted in the gym on Tuesday and Wednesday evening. I thank the staff for the time and commitment put in offering our parent community the opportunity to visit and speak in person to discuss the learning progress our students are making at the school. Organising a large event at the school does not just happen, it takes much planning and preparation. I acknowledge the diligent work of Mrs Wrigley, Mrs Klajnblat, Mrs Jones and Miss Roolker, Mr Ross, Mr Carey and Glenn our on-site service assistant and the office staff. Interviews conducted: 781 with teachers, 12 English as an Additional Language and 20 Literacy intervention interviews. I invite parents to provide feedback for improvement on any aspect of the interviews by contacting the school.

This week I had the opportunity to participate in the Bike Education course community bike ride with our students. During our ride along footpaths and tracks, it was wonderful to see our students demonstrating their skills learnt during the Bike Ed sessions. Some of the skills included riding in file, braking, hand signals and dismounting to cross roads. I thank Mr Shaw and Mr Carey for delivering the Bike Ed program. The school has a class set of quality bikes and helmets to ensure all students have access to the program.

Early next term I will be meeting with the City of Casey to develop a memorandum of understanding for the shared use of the sporting field complex adjacent to the school oval. I have been informed by the City of Casey Stage 1 of the project is to commence later in the year. The City of Casey also informed the school of a staffed pedestrian crossing is to be established on Bowyer Avenue at the front of school during the coming term holidays. The crossing will assist students and parents safe access to and from the school when crossing Bowyer Avenue.

Under the leadership of Miss Hampson and Miss Felmingham our Student Representative Council have organised a free dress day by gold coin donation for this Friday. All students across the school are invited to participate on the day and strongly encouraged to wear any item of Richmond footy clothing. Please ensure students wear closed in shoes and suitable clothes to keep warm during the recess and lunch. The total gold coin donation is to be made to <u>Backpacks 4 VIC Kids'</u>. This is an excellent opportunity for our students to assist others in our community.

Please note the school dismisses at 2:30pm on Friday and all staff will be departing the school site soon after dismissal time. Arrangements can be made with Camp Australia, our out of hours school care program.

The holiday time is a perfect opportunity to visit the local library in order to keep up the daily reading – remember reading every day does make an incredible difference.

As the term draws to a close I pass on my appreciation and to thank our students for the many times we all have observed students achieving and showing learning growth in many ways in their learning. Seeing those 'lightbulb' moments is very rewarding for our teams of teachers. Thank you to parents for supporting the many programs at school.

# From the Welfare Officer

## **Understanding behaviour**

Starting school involves a big change for your child. It is normal for children to have strong feelings as they start to think about these changes, such as excitement about the prospect of going to school as well as nervousness about what lies ahead. Your child may also be feeling sad or angry about leaving early childhood education and care. This includes letting go of relationships formed with educators and other children, as well as a change to their familiar routines.

Some common feelings children have during transition to school can include:

- excitement
- sadness
- anger
- anticipation
- fear or anxiety.

Understanding and helping your child to handle the feelings associated with starting school will help to reduce their stress and can provide them with positive coping strategies.

## **Common behaviours**

Young children often have difficulty explaining in words how they feel. Instead they may show their feelings through their behaviour. Some behaviours may be easier to spot like tantrums and crying, while others may be more diffi cult to notice like being quieter than usual. During the transition to school you may notice the following behaviours emerge or increase in frequency:

- clinging behaviour (eg not wanting to separate from you)
- restlessness (eg difficulty settling at activities, easily distracted, fidgeting)
- withdrawing (eg not participating in familiar activities, less engaged, less willing to persist)
- being anxious (eg shyness, fidgeting, stomach aches, needing excessive reassurance around the routines or plans for the day)
- refusing to comply (eg not wanting to follow rules and routines)
- avoidance strategies (eg increased negotiations around participation)
- planning and organisation difficulties (eg trouble getting started, remembering or finishing tasks)
- increase in crying and tantrums (eg more often or in more situations)
- changes in eating habits (eg loss of appetite, becomes fussy with food, overeating)
- sleep difficulties (eg trouble falling or staying asleep, nightmares)
- regression to younger behaviours (eg bedwetting, thumb sucking, baby talk)
- aggressive behaviours (eg hitting, kicking, shouting).

These behaviours are examples of different ways children respond to challenging situations. They are very typical for children within this age group and you have probably already noticed some of these behaviours during other times of change. However, if the behaviours persist or are interfering with your child's daily life it is a good idea to get further help.
