Accredited Epilepsy School. Our school is now an accredited Epilepsy School and I thank Mrs Natalie Okey for her work in arranging the training and the staff who participated in the accredited training sessions and assessment. This achievement further supports the students at risk while at school and attending camps, excursions, swimming etc.

Off Site Evacuation Rehearsal. As part of our ongoing commitment to OHS practices and Emergency Management processes, next week on Thursday 16th August we will be conducting an off-site evacuation rehearsal for all staff and students. Thorough planning has produced a detailed plan in order for our walk to our designated Off-site Evacuation Point in the neighbouring Statesman Park (located on Statesman Drive). A note has been sent home to parents and is posted on Compass. Should parents have any questions you are invited to contact Mrs Wrigley at the school.

The staff will be participating in a DET Cultural Understanding and Safety Training (CUST) initiative. The program focuses on a key commitment in the Marrung: Aboriginal Education Plan. This program aims to increase understanding of Koorie culture, history and experience to ensure a strong foundation for culturally inclusive teaching, learning and welfare practices.

The Student Representative Council (SRC) recently planted shrubs at the front of school as part of National Tree Planting Day. The students are to be congratulated for their work and to parents for their support on the day. The area which is adjacent to the staff car park is to be supplemented with mulch and fruit trees.

The 2018 Parent Opinion Survey is now open and this year we have invited all families (through email) to provide feedback to the school on all matters of school operations. Growth Mindset: Metacognition

Metacognition is the ability to reflect on our own thoughts. It is thinking about our thinking. It helps us understand our feelings, needs and behaviours. It helps us adapt to challenges, new experiences, and frustrating experiences. Being metacognitive can help us move from a fixed mindset (I can't do this) to a growth mindset (I can't do this ...YET). Talk openly with your child about one strength and one weakness they feel they have. Talk about strategies they have used or can use to help them in areas they are weak in.

Discuss the following questions:

1. How can being metacognitive help move you from a fixed mindset to a growth mindset?
2. What is something you can do if you feel confused about something?

2019 Booklists

You should have received the 2019 Booklists last week. The Essential Student Item cost will remain at \$180.00 for years 1-6 and \$190.00 for prep students (includes \$10.00 book bag). You will have the opportunity to pay off your fees up until 15th November 2018. A payment schedule has been provided, however you can pay off any amount at any time until the cut off date.

Our school makes every effort to reduce financial pressure on families by allowing plenty of time for payment, and sourcing the best price for supplies. It is important to note: If you are unable to pay in full by the due date you should contact the office. If you set up a Payment Plan after the cut off date, the book pack will not be released until full payment has been received. Of course, no student will be disadvantaged at our school, and will always have access to essential items for learning. If you choose to purchase your own books, this should be done in consultation with the school. Please contact us to discuss.

The \$180.00 fee includes your child's book pack and essential items supplied directly from the school to your child.
