FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Hi everyone

It is with disappointment I write to remind parents and visitors of the expectation to demonstrate acceptable forms of conduct while on the school site.

The Department of Education and Training including this school is committed to providing a safe and supportive work environment where everyone is treated with respect, fairness and dignity. Swearing, harassment, bullying, violence and threatening behaviour directed at staff, students or visitors is unacceptable and a zero tolerance policy will apply.

I, along with the school leadership team, will act to ensure that the safety, security, health and wellbeing of all staff and students are protected. Visitors to the school who act in an inappropriate, unacceptable or threatening way will be denied access to the school, a Trespass Order issued and the matter referred to the police.

This week the school hosted a delegation of twenty-two visitors from Vietnam who toured the school facility to investigate the highly successful Partnerships model which underpins school operations. The school captains welcomed the delegation to the school and presented a small gift to each of the visitors. The delegates were amazed at the quality of teaching and learning, the world-class design and layout of the facility and the connectedness of students to their learning. This was another excellent opportunity to showcase the school in an international forum.

Last week Michelle Wrigley, Kathy Jones and myself returned to school after attending the 12th Convention of the International Confederation of Principals Conference in Helsinki, Finland. The conference attracted over 1100 Principals from across the world coming together to share best practice in educational leadership and innovative and successful initiatives to improve student-learning outcomes. Finland has the highest level of academic achievement of all surveyed countries for reading, mathematics and sciences. Some interesting facts include: no tuition fees, no school uniforms, lunch provided daily, worlds largest coffee drinkers and no formal standardised student assessment. Any member of the public can visit a classroom at any time to observe a lesson. The visit was highly successful in all respects and a wonderful opportunity for new learning to occur and to confirm the direction of the school and school leadership in providing the very best care and learning opportunities for our students.

This week our Year Three students in group one attended the Briars Outdoor Educational Camp. While the weather was not the best this did not stop our students from participating enthusiastically in the activities including the flying fox, commando course, archery, 'leap of faith', giant swing and much more. Many students have said they did not want to leave. Group two departed for camp on Wednesday and this morning I visited the students and participated in activities with the students.

Today parents of students in Year Three and Year Five will receive the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) Student Report 2015. The school values highly the data sets gained from NAPLAN assessment, which forms part of overall student assessment and assists with directing future resources and planning of the curriculum. Parents are invited to contact the school with any questions regarding the report.

Please ensure your child reads on a daily basis and is on time at school each day to commence their learning.

Thank you to the Parents and students who have offered their time or the loan of items for display. The actual timeline for this day is in the process of being organised and will be sent out soon.

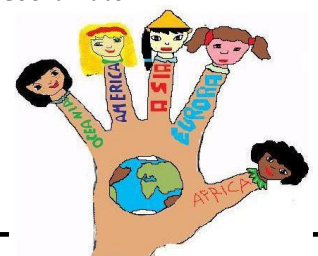
