Hi Everyone

The school is currently undergoing a Peer Review of school's performance against a consistent set of statewide measures about students' achievement, engagement and wellbeing and the productivity within the school. The Review will include a registration requirements check (based on the Victorian Registration and Qualifications Authority minimum standards for school registration). The Review is based on self-evaluation which is an opportunity to reflect on the school's achievements in a systematic and comprehensive way by: conducting a thorough analysis of data from the previous year, recognising and celebrating the school's successes, and identifying areas where the school could focus future effort.

During the Review an analysis is completed on input in consultation with the school community based on data provided from Parent Opinion Surveys and other data including Student and Staff surveys over the past four years. Parents are invited to provide additional written feedback on their opinion of performance of the school and areas for future improvement. While this is a broad request for feedback, all feedback provided will be considered by the Peer Review team.

Invitations to our annual Parent Helpers Morning Tea will be sent home today. The morning tea is recognition of the valuable support from parents to all aspects of school operations including camps, excursions, reading programs etc. Should you not receive an invitation for your contribution to the school, I ask you contact me immediately. Office Reminder: Parent Messages for Students

Parents are reminded that phone calls to the office requesting messages be passed onto students should be received by 3.00pm.

The school grounds are monitored by yard duty teachers after school from 3.15pm to 3.30pm daily. If you pick up your child and are running late but expect to arrive at the school by 3.30pm your child will be safe in the school grounds. Please discuss this with your child and have a pre-arranged meeting spot if this situation should occur. Students are not permitted to wait in the school for parents arriving prior to 3.30pm unless there are special circumstances. Any student's remaining in the yard after 3.30pm will be brought inside the school by teachers. Students should not remain at school after 3.30pm unless parents have notified the office and provided an adequate reason. School phones will not be monitored from 4.00 when the office closes. The school's front door's automatically lock at 3.45pm.

If your child is collected by a Secondary College student, please ensure they have a pre-arranged safe meeting place within the school boundary outside of the main building (not in the office). Secondary students are reminded to pick up their siblings promptly.

We ask parents to support the school regarding the above, as messages to classrooms can be disruptive to teaching and learning. Parents are encouraged to discuss and reinforce after school pick up, or after school care arrangements with their child/ren before they come to school.
