Science

The 2024 Science program will be focusing on Physical and Chemical Sciences. Each unit will focus heavily on engaging hands-on experiences and experiments that are designed to develop scientific understanding and inquiry skills. Our Physical Science program will focus on forces, motion, and energy. This unit will require batteries, wires, light globes, led lights, copper tape, foil, marbles, and tubing. Our Chemical Science program will focus on solids, liquids, gases, and the physical changes that can occur when substances are combined or changed. This unit will require transparent bottles, bicarb soda, oil, vinegar, yeast, food dye, detergent, and Ziplock bags.

Numeracy

Investing in a range of hands-on numeracy resources such as stopwatches, abacuses, clocks, calculators, trundle wheels, numeracy blocks, counters, and dice. The school also invested in Jo Boaler's books 'Mathematical Mindset: Visualising and Investigating big ideas' for different levels to further support teachers in developing numeracy in the Learning Spaces.

Sports

The Sports and PE program allocate funds to a number of areas that allow the school to deliver the Victorian Curriculum. Performing Arts

The Performing Arts program is an enriching experience for our students. They explore various aspects of music, drama and dance including historical and cultural elements. Students use an assortment of instruments, props and costumes, puppets and scripts, while also engaging in activities that require paper, books, folders, pens and markers.

Auslan

Auslan (Australian Sign Language) is the language of Australia's Deaf community. The language has its own linguistic features and the people have a rich history and culture. Our Auslan program provides students with an authentic way of learning the language using dominant hand bands, flash cards, visual aids, and specially designed Auslan books.

FREE INSTRUCTION

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

• Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES
