

Welcome back to Term 4 to all our Foundation families. We hope that everyone had a safe and happy break.








This term we have so many fun and exciting things planned. In Literacy we have been enjoying reading the stories, 'The Day the Crayons Quit' and 'The Day the Crayons Came Home'. We have been predicting what the stories might be about, using the front cover as our prompt and building our comprehension skills using inferencing. In Maths we have been using number lines and tens frames as a tool to support our learning with addition and subtraction. During our Maths sessions we have a "warmup focus", which this fortnight has been practicing naming, correctly writing and drawing the amount to match our teen numbers.







On Tuesday we had an Incursion from Splashes Swimming School where the students learnt about water safety. The students participated in role play about how to be safe around water.


Year 1



A very warm welcome back to all our Year 1 students and families! We hope you all had a lovely holiday break.



In Reading we have been practicing reading accurately and fluently. We have also been practicing our speaking and listening skills in a mini 'Book Club' with our friends. Students have shared who is in their story, where the characters are and what they are doing. In Writing, students have been developing lots of interesting ideas and have included those ideas in their narratives. There has been lots of focus on the characters, setting, problem, solution and an











Year 2

Welcome back Year 2 families. We hope you had a fun and relaxing holiday.

The students have settled back into their routines and are doing great learning in Year 2 classes, but our highlight of the week is swimming lessons. The students loved getting wet, jumping and splashing in the pool. They all learnt

different safety and survival skills around water.



In Numeracy we all practiced different addition and subtraction skills through money. We created a Classroom Economy project for which they will have to do some jobs around the classrooms to earn money. We also

created a chart of fines and rewards for the students to keep the money moving around the room. Students love counting and handling their money.

In Literacy we have focused on ensuring that our sentences are structured correctly. We have practiced including extra details in our sentences by adding time and location words to make their writing more precise. We have also looked at how the messages


are conveyed to the readers through pictures, colours, signs and fonts in the books. We have also practiced being kind to everyone around us and how to manage our behaviour if we are angry or frustrated. We have also focused on looking at our strengths and being proud of ourselves in our wellbeing lessons.



Year 3

Term 4 has started off well. We have all jumped into our learning and settled back into the classroom routines. In Literacy in both reading and writing the students have been learning about how to recognise the author's purpose, why the author may have written the stories, topics, articles and advertisements that they have researched. As the students have gone through this unit, they have been able to integrate this knowledge into their own writing. They have had to think about who they are writing for, have a purpose for writing it and find their own voice as they do so. Students have had a lot of fun as they have developed their own products, made a pamphlet to describe, instruct, inform their readers and made jingles to persuade and entertain their potential buyers.

In Maths this term we have been learning about multiplication, division, area and how these topics relate to each other. Students have felt confident when using arrays to work out multiplication problems and learning to do the



inverse operation like 3x7 = 21 and the inverse is $27 \div 7 = 3$. They have learnt how these skills apply to an area of an object, which is just like an array. It has been great to see their excitement as they make these discoveries.

This term in Civics and Citizenship unit, our focus has been all about understanding rules, laws and exploring the crucial factors that contribute

to their fairness and equity. We have also been learning about factors that shape and contribute to a person's identity and sense of belonging.

Year 4



Welcome back Year 4's!

We hope you had a wonderful break and are feeling rejuvenated and eager for an exhilarating Term 4.

This term, students will embark on an engaging new Curriculum Connections unit titled 'Design Tech,' where they will explore and analyse the evolution of technology, with a special focus on the world of gaming.

Additionally, our Literacy unit has kicked off with enthusiasm, centred around the ABC iView series 'Hardball.' Students have been actively engaging with the material, delving into character analysis and examining the key components of the show. In Numeracy, we are building on our understanding of equivalent fractions and their relationship with decimals. Students will have the exciting opportunity to apply this knowledge in our brand-new unit on 'Money.'



We are thrilled to continue our incredible journey into Term 4 and look forward to all the amazing learning experiences ahead!

Year 5




Welcome back to term 4. The students have made a great start and have been working hard.

In Literacy, during Reading, we have been focusing on making inferences and author's intended purpose. Students have been working on adding detail to their explanation and discussing the clues they used and their prior knowledge. We have now begun exploring how writers make successful and powerful arguments in persuasive texts. In Writing, the students have been working on several different types of poetry including limericks, haikus, cinquains, tankas and free verse. They have been very creative and getting involved in this unit. We have also started a

new unit on Persuasive Writing, where the students focus on including persuasive devices in

their arguments to make them more effective.

During Numeracy, students have worked through a unit of time learning how to tell the time on analogue and digital clocks and reading 24hr time and calculating elapsed time. We have just started working on a unit learning how to read grid references, shape and translation.



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Year 6

Last term of Year 6 for our class of 2024! Our students are very excited for the term ahead, looking forward to the



many activities planned. As our students start preparing for high school, we will begin transition activities with Cranbourne East Secondary School, learning to read and interpret timetables, and practicing locker combinations. Exciting stuff!

In Reading, students are analysing the text Charlotte's Web and making in-depth comparisons between the book and the film. In Writing, we are looking at the different kinds of poetry,



encouraging personal expression with our students' own poetry by using personal experience, passions and world issues as inspiration. In Maths, students are understanding the cost of owning pets in the current economy, looking at percentages, discounts and best buys. Introducing our Design and Technology unit has been amazing. Looking at threatened and endangered species within Australia and beyond and researching ways we can use modern technology to conserve those species.

We wish the cricket team good luck as they represent CEPS in the next stage of Lightning Prem on Friday the 18^{th of} October. We are looking forward to our Melbourne Zoo excursion in Week 3, Friday the 25th.

Exciting things ahead for our students in Term 4

Specialist in Focus - PE

Students from Foundation to Year 6 have been actively participating in activities designed to enhance their striking and fielding skills. Throughout their PE lessons, they have practiced a variety of techniques, including batting, catching, and throwing, tailored to their respective skill levels. The younger students have focused on developing fundamental hand-eye coordination and basic motor skills, while older students have worked on refining more advanced strategies like positioning, teamwork, and game tactics. These activities not only improve their technical abilities but also foster teamwork, spatial awareness, and communication on the field.

Specialist in Focus - Wellbeing



Welcome to a brand-new term of Wellbeing learning. We have begun our exploration of 'Positive Gender Relations' within all Wellbeing classes which will cover setting boundaries, fair play in the school yard, active respect in all relationships and creating a gender friendly classroom.

This week we jumped into fair play and how to set clear rules and boundaries before starting a game with friends. Year 1 students were fantastic at this as we broke off into small groups and talked through how to best feel heard and make sure the play is fair for everyone. In groups, Year 1's decided that the following steps would ensure fair play before a round of 'Rock, Paper, Scissors'.

- 1. Go over and agree upon the game rules
- 2. Make sure everyone understands the rules
- 3. Agree to not change the rules during play
- 4. Listen to each other and feel safe to share ideas
- 5. Always be honest and own your mistakes
- 6. Have fun!



It was wonderful to see them holding each other accountable throughout the activity and use the rules to support fair play. Our aim is to support these emerging skills as they transfer into the playground and will continue supporting our young students in putting these ideas into action.




